Supported by the Finnish Presidency of the EU Council, the European Vocational Skills Week 2019 central events took place in Helsinki from **14–18 October**.

SOCIAL MEDIA AND WEB¹

The social media campaign reached **over 36.6 million** people, compared to 34 million people reached last year,² raising VET awareness and celebrating citizen engagement with the campaign.

Hashtags **#EUVocationalSkills** and **#DiscoverYourTalent** collected over **97 million** impressions³, compared to **94.5 million** impressions in 2018.

Over 240 VET professionals joined the EVSW Facebook private group, with more than 1,200 reactions.

NATIONAL, REGIONAL AND LOCAL WEEK-ASSOCIATED EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

Top countries by number of events and activities:



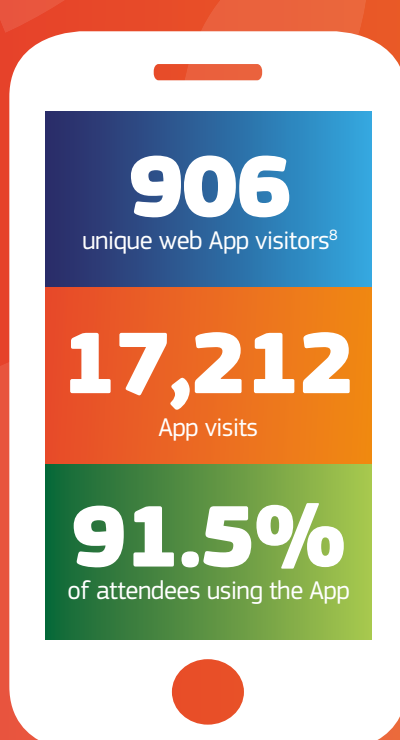
